MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION PROCEDURE

An individual interested in purchasing a membership in Walnut Creek Country Club should contact a member to request information. The Club's General Manager will provide the individual with a membership packet including:

- ◆ Informational letter
- ◆ Application for membership
- ◆ Application procedure form
- ◆ Information on fees and dues
- ◆ A copy of The Connection, our club's newsletter

The application form contains space for the applicant to submit names of three (3) current, Regular Members in good standing who will be willing to serve as sponsors for the applicant. The sponsor will be asked to submit a letter of recommendation on the prospective member's behalf.

The completed application is to be submitted, by the member, to the Club's General Manager, accompanied by the sponsors' letters of recommendation, a check made payable to Walnut Creek Country Club for the purchase price established, and a recent picture of the applicant (required) and family (if possible). In addition, the signed initiation fee agreement and promissory note.

The applicant and sponsor names will be posted for 14 days on the bulletin board in the Clubhouse, and notice of the application will be included in the Club newsletter on the web site.

The application and sponsor recommendations will be forwarded by the General Manager to the Membership Committee. The committee will arrange an interview with the applicant during the 14 day posting period.

After the interview, the committee will return the application with approval signature and sponsors' recommendations to the Club's General Manager for review by the Board of Directors. Approval action will be taken at the next Board of Directors' meeting after the required 14 day posting and membership notification. A majority vote of the Directors shall be necessary for election.

After final approval by the Board, the new member will receive the following:

- Letter of Welcome
- Stock Certificate with Membership Number (Regular Member Only-once the 3rd installment is paid)
- Membership card (s)
- Copy of Club Bylaws
- Club Roster
- Tournament Booklet and Golf Rules

The member is now accorded the full rights and privileges of Walnut Creek Country Club as established by the Club's Bylaws and policies of the Board of Directors. The member is entitled to receive all Club mailings, have guests, charge all the expenditures at the Club to his house account (using the membership number) and is liable for all dues, fees and assessments charged to the membership account.

Walnut Creek Country Club Dress Code
Revised February 17, 2010



DRESS CODE

Walnut Creek Country Club is an exclusive, member owned, private country club with the aim of a relaxed, but conservative, dress code. Tasteful and appropriate attire is expected at all times.

- Members, children ages four (4) and older, guests and visitors are expected to be suitably attired at all times on Club premises. Members are responsible for informing their guests of the dress requirements prior to their arrival at the Club.
- All clothing worn must be neat, clean, un-tattered and otherwise orderly. Appropriate shoes or dress sandals must be worn everywhere in the Club with the exception of the pool area.

Dining throughout the year will be informal and casual (country club casual) except for special events, which may be designated as formal/semi-formal.

INAPPROPRIATE DRESS-CLUBWIDE

Rules cannot be written that can possibly address every instance of inappropriate dress, but here are some requirements.

- No ripped, soiled, stained, cut off or see-through clothing.
- No T-shirts, cropped tops, tube tops or bra type tops, except in the pool and tennis areas.
- Undergarments (or private areas of skin) should never be visible.
- Slacks and shorts must be worn at the waist line.
- Unless specifically authorized and published for special functions, NO BLUE DENIM (shirt, skirt, jacket or pants) of any style is permitted on club property.
- Changing of any clothing must be done in a locker room. Changing of any clothing, including shoes in the parking lot, is prohibited.

CLUBHOUSE

- Men's shirts specifically designed to be worn outside the pants or shorts (i.e. tropical shirts) are acceptable. A turtleneck or mock turtleneck is considered a collared shirt.
- Women's sleeveless or spaghetti strap dress or top that is part of an outfit is acceptable as long as it does not bare any midriff and is of a conservative cut.
- Mid-thigh length skirts and shorts are appropriate.
- After tennis and swimming, coming to the Clubhouse requires appropriate warm-up/cover up-attire and shoes.
- Soft spike golf shoes are allowed in the West Grille and Locker Rooms only.
- Sport hats are permitted on the Patio and West Grille and Locker Rooms only. The bill of the cap must be worn forward.

FORMAL BRUNCHES-Christmas, Easter and Mother's Day

- To respect occasions: jackets are required and ties are recommended for all men 16 years and older.
- Appropriate attire for women includes: dresses, dinner suits, skirts and dress slacks with appropriate top.

TENNIS COURTS

- Tennis shoes and tennis attire are required for play on all courts. White and/or colors are acceptable.
- No street shoes, swimsuits, or cut-off blue denim pants or shorts are allowed.

POOL

- Appropriate cover-up and shoes/sandals should be worn to and from the pool and in the parking lot.
- Blue denim/cut-off shorts are not permitted in the pool area.

GOLF COURSE AND RANGE

- Children under the age of 16 years old, using the golf course, must change shoes in the Halfway House, Cart Barn or Pool locker rooms.
- Men's golf shirts must have a 1" collar (mock turtlenecks are acceptable) and are to be tucked in at all times.
- Women's sleeveless golf shirts must have a 1" collar.
- Sport hats must be worn forward.
- Shorts and golf skirts must be at least mid-thigh in length.
- Newer golf apparel sold by popular golf manufacturers will be allowed under the condition they are in keeping with our policy of appropriate dress codes.
- Inappropriate attire includes: short shorts or skirts, t-shirts, tank tops, coaches' shorts, tennis or swimming attire.
- **NOT ALL CLOTHING SOLD IN THE PRO SHOP IS GOLF COURSE APPROPRIATE**

HOUSE RULES



The House Committee is in charge of all matters pertaining to the Clubhouse, its operation, maintenance, etc. This committee is authorized to enforce the following rules and regulations, which may be amended from time to time as conditions demand.

1. All services of the Clubhouse are discontinued on Mondays, except when a recognized holiday falls on Monday; in which case the Club services are discontinued on Tuesday.
2. Members shall not reprimand employees. All complaints or suggestions must be made to the House Committee or General Manager.
3. Employees are not permitted to leave the Clubhouse on errands or for any other service for members, except Club business.
4. Members are required to sign their names and numbers to chits or checks for everything ordered in the Clubhouse.
5. Property of the Club must not be taken from the premises of the Club, except that which is required for limited catering, which in no way can be allowed to conflict with or hamper the service of the Club. Any property sent out by the Club shall be charged to the member whose account shall receive proper credit upon return of the property.
6. Arrangements for special luncheons, parties, or any unscheduled use of the Club facilities must be made through Club management. This should be done as far ahead of the desired date as possible.
7. Solicitations of funds or any other monies from Club members on Club property by a fellow member for any outside organization is strictly prohibited unless permission has been granted by the Board of Directors. The Club Roster and membership list is provided for social or Club business only. Use of the Club Roster for solicitation, advertising, business prospecting or any other commercial purpose is strictly prohibited. Sanctions will be exercised for any violation of this rule.
8. The Club is not responsible for personal property of members and guests in the coat check room or anywhere on Club premises.
9. The Club is not responsible for damage to parked automobiles or for theft of personal effects left in automobiles.
10. Minors under the legal age of majority, including sons or daughters of guests or members, shall not be served intoxicating drinks in any part of the Clubhouse even though parental permission may have been obtained. This is a State Law; any violation thereof may incur loss of license of the Club. Members shall be responsible for the conduct of, and any bills incurred by, their children and guests regardless of age. Any member deliberately violating this rule shall be subject to disciplinary action by the Board.
11. The comfort and convenience of all members shall best be served by strict observance of the By-Laws and House Rules. Violations shall be deemed grounds for suspension. The General Manager is instructed to notify members of any violation of the rules and report to the House Committee.
12. A 18% gratuity plus tax is assessed to all restaurant and bar checks. Additional gratuity may be added at the member's discretion. The Club is operated on a charge basis. No cash tipping is allowed, except for the locker room, bag handlers, coat check and parking attendants, providing such services do not carry the 18% gratuity. Members shall be responsible for the strict observation of this rule by their guests. Violation of the rules shall be subject to disciplinary action for members and employees.
13. Members and guests shall not bring liquor or food onto Club premises. All State liquor laws and regulations shall be strictly observed.
14. No children under the age of 16 are allowed in the West Grille, unless there is no other dining facility available.
15. All cars will proceed slowly and carefully in the driveway and parking areas of the Club, giving right-of-way to pedestrians. The speed limit on Club grounds is 10 miles per hour maximum. Entrances and exits will be kept clear at all times. Park only in designated areas, and make sure the proper traffic flow is used when entering/ exiting the Club.
16. Storage of golf clubs will not be allowed in men's or women's lockers at any time.
17. The conduct of all members must be above reproach in all Club areas including the entire Clubhouse, patio area, Club grounds, golf course, children's mini-course, Halfway House, Poolhouse, snack shop facilities and all locker rooms. Parents will be held responsible for the behavior of their children; therefore, parents are requested to caution their children that they must observe all rules and obey instructions of the Club's management staff and other employees.
18. Cell phone conversations are not allowed in the Main Dining Room and East Grille areas. If you receive a call, you must leave these areas, and carry on any conversations or place any calls from the bathrooms or locker room areas, West Grille, Lobby, Halfway House or Patio area. All cell phones and beepers must be kept on vibrate mode, if possible. Members are responsible for their guests' cell phone usage. In light of recent technological advances concerning cellular telephones, Club members and guests are hereby prohibited from using the digital photograph component of cellular phones while on Club property. Use of this feature includes, but is not limited to, collecting and storing digital images of any kind. This policy is designed to protect the privacy rights of Club members, as well as the proprietary rights of the Club.

GOLF COURSE HOURS

The following hours of play will be observed during the period May 1 through October 1, unless otherwise noted:

SATURDAY: Only the Men's League may play before 10:00 a.m. Juniors will not be permitted to use the course until 1:00pm. Unapproved juniors may play after 5:00pm when accompanied by a parent. Guests will not be permitted to tee off before 11:00am with the exception of out-of- state guests by prior arrangement with the Golf Professional.

SUNDAY & HOLIDAYS: Approved juniors may play after 1:00pm. Unapproved juniors may play after 4:00pm when accompanied by a parent. Guests will not be permitted to tee off before 10:00am with the exception of out-of-state guests by prior arrangement with the Golf Professional.

MONDAY: No membership play is allowed.

TUESDAY: From mid-June through late August (when junior golf is scheduled), no one except juniors may tee off before 11:00am. Juniors will not be permitted to tee off between the hours of 12:00pm and 2:00pm. Unapproved Juniors may play after 6:00pm when accompanied by a parent.

WEDNESDAY: The Women's 9 Hole League will have one nine closed for regular league play. The other nine will be open for members starting at 8:00am. Juniors will not be permitted to tee off between 12:00pm and 3:00pm. Unapproved juniors may play after 6:00pm when accompanied by a parent.

THURSDAY: The Women's 18 Hole League will have one nine closed for regular play. The other nine will be open for members starting at 8:00am. Juniors will not be permitted to tee off between 12:00pm and 3:00pm. Unapproved juniors may play after 6:00pm when accompanied by a parent.

FRIDAY: Juniors will not be permitted to tee off between 12:00pm and 2:00pm. Unapproved juniors may play after 6:00pm when accompanied by a parent.

STARTING TIME PLAN

- 1) Club competitions will be given priority.
- 2) Starting times will be every eight minutes.
- 3) Starting times may be obtained for any day, four days preceding.

SATURDAY: Starting times for Saturday after 10:00am may be obtained by telephone after 8:00am on the Tuesday prior to that Saturday.

Men's League Play - 7:00am to 10:00am.

1. Two (2) or more men may request a starting time by presenting themselves to the Starter after 7:00am.
2. All members of a twosome, threesome or foursome must be present, ready to play, and must sign their names and Club numbers.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES

Walnut Creek Country Club sponsors many programs to promote youth activities in the areas of golf, tennis and swimming. All Junior programs are instructed and administered by our golf, tennis, and swim staff professionals. Participants are required to adhere to particular dress code policies, and the administering professionals may regulate youth participation.

Golf

Junior Advantage—For children between the ages of 4 and 9. This program is designed to introduce children to each of the programs we offer in the areas of golf, swim, and tennis, consisting of four 3-hour sessions. (*Available for all membership classifications*).

Junior Golf—For children between the ages of 7 and 18. Within this program, there are different classes of players: 3-Holer, 6-Holer, 9-Holer and 18-Holer. Golfers are grouped by skill, age and maturity. Scheduled events include the Junior Club Championship, Family Fun Day and Banquet, and group and individual golf lessons. (*For Regular Members Only*).

Little Linkers- A separate six week lesson program is available for children, ages 5-6. (*For Regular Members only*).

Tennis

Private Lessons or Organized Practice-Are available for children, as well as adults..

Junior Tennis—For children between the ages of 4 and 17. This program runs in the summer months and involves stroke production, strategic play drills, and round-robin singles/doubles play. Lessons are offered for juniors based upon player classifications: TinyTots, Junior Stars, Challengers, Future Stars, Super Excellence and Tournament Elite (JV and Varsity High School Level). Scheduled events include the Junior Club Championship and Junior Tennis Inter-Club Tournament.

Pool

Our swim team, the Whitecaps, swims competitively against many of the private country clubs in the golf district. The team is open to any interested child able to swim the length of the pool. Swimming lessons are available for all ages. Many swim events are scheduled throughout the swimming season.

Holiday Events—Holidays are happy times for the children of Walnut Creek Country Club!

Easter Sunday—Children are invited to participate in an egg hunt and a visit with the Easter Bunny. In addition, a petting farm is brought in to the delight of many.

Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Labor Day are special family holidays. Scheduled activities may include a magician's visit, swimming contests, and organized age-appropriate games. One of our newer traditions is our own spectacular fireworks display for the Fourth of July holiday.

Christmas brings the annual Children's Christmas Party, with all the festivities including photos with Santa Claus, entertainment, clowns, arts and crafts and a holiday buffet to satisfy all appetites.

Other special events are scheduled throughout the calendar year.

POOL AND TENNIS

General Information

POOL

1. Pool Hours: The pool is open for swimming from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m., Tuesday through Sunday (closed on Mondays except for a Monday holiday). These hours are subject to change without notice. The pool is used between 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. Tuesday through Saturday for swim team practice (4 practices per week – 1 ½ hours per practice). Sunday morning clinics are from 11 a.m. until 12 noon. The use of the pool during other hours is prohibited.
2. Walnut Creek Country Club assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to personal property or injury to anyone.
3. The Board of Directors has given full authority to the Pool Manager and lifeguards to interpret and enforce all rules. Failure to comply with any rules shall be considered sufficient cause for immediate suspension of pool privileges for the offending member, at the discretion of the Pool Manager or General Manager. If the Pool Manager feels the seriousness of the situation warrants, he may request the General Manager and/or the Board of Directors to take further action.
4. The conduct of all members must be above reproach in all Club areas including shower rooms, parking areas, pool, eating area and office. Parents will be held responsible for the behavior of their children; therefore, parents are requested to caution their children that they must observe all rules and obey instructions of the Pool Manager and other employees. Members will be held responsible for the behavior of their guests.

ADMITTANCE TO THE POOL

1. To be left unattended, children between the ages of 8 and 12 must pass a swim test given by a pool staff member (this test will consist of swimming 25 meters without assistance). All children under the age of eight must be accompanied by a parent or adult member (adult guest permitted).
2. All guests must be properly registered by a Club member prior to admission to the Club facilities.
3. Children must be over the age of two and fully toilet trained in order to be permitted in the adult pool.

TENNIS

1. There is no charge to members.
2. All court reservations are to be made through the Tennis Office.
3. Singles play will be limited to one (1) hour while others are waiting to play.
4. Doubles play will be limited to one (1) hour while others are waiting to play.
5. Any player after completing singles or doubles will not be permitted back on the court for one half hour if there are any players waiting.
6. No court may be used until the member arrives at courtside, dressed and ready to play. When people are waiting, court changes will be made on the hour, depending on whether members are playing singles or doubles. A court may not be held by one person, if others are waiting.
7. The regular guest rules of the Club shall apply to tennis playing guests. The host member must be present at all times when his/her guest(s) are participating in tennis.
8. The Club will provide a daily posted sheet of court assignments.
9. No food or beverage is allowed on courts.
10. No one may enter or cross-courts when the ball is in play.
11. Non-players must remain outside the fenced area.
12. Complimentary towels will be provided on the court.
13. Water and cups will be provided on the court.
14. Children not old enough to be junior players (13-15 years), must get approval from the Tennis Pro to be on the courts without an adult.
15. Nets must remain at the height at which they are set. They will be checked daily by the staff.
16. Admission to the event will be denied if the dress code is not followed.
17. Any changing of apparel, including shoes, must be done in a locker room and will not be allowed in parking lot areas. Children under the age of 16 are not allowed in the Clubhouse locker rooms. Children under the age of 16, using the golf course, must change shoes in the Halfway House locker room.
18. Members are expected to exercise discretion, propriety and good taste in their dress at all times. Members are responsible for the attire of their guests.
19. Tennis shoes and regulation tennis attire are required for play on all courts. White and/or colors are acceptable.
20. No street shoes, swimsuits, cut-off jeans, tank shirts or jogging shorts are allowed.
21. The Club staff has jurisdiction on proper attire.
